- Reading Ms. Muller
  - Retelling Fiction
  - Book Baggies have been sent home with phonics readers- keep practicing for fluency and confidence
  - Choice board is used during reading
  - Readers' Workshop will begin soon now that we are in person to incorporate hands on games and activities
- Writing Mrs. Fullerton
  - Student authors are writing their own chapter books about an animal- students are very excited
  - Students will create a ChatterPix
    - similar to the animal doing the pledge during Dr. Podraza's announcements
  - Will next move to narrative writing (Small Moments) to enhance those skills before returning to persuasive writing at the end of the year
  - Phonics work
- Math Ms. Klink
  - Measurement unit is wrapping up students love it bc it is so hands on
  - Fell at the perfect time with the students returning to in-person learning
  - Upcoming modules include double-digit numbers and place value
  - Counting up to 120
  - Working on addition and subtraction fact fluency
  - Recognizing math vocabulary and utilizing strategies while solving word problems
- Generally Speaking Ms. Muller
  - Working on classroom expectations, routines, and organizing materials
    - We are working through March curriculum while seeing some August behaviors
  - Students love the hands-on activities
  - Handwriting is being reinforced to address reversals, etc
- How Can I Be Involved at Home? Mrs. Fullerton
  - Book bags are sent home use those towards Dr Podraza's Million Page Challenge
    - Teachers have implemented a tally system to assist with 1st graders tracking their own pages
  - Read high-interest books
  - Encouraging using school and classroom libraries and filling their in school book bag
  - Instead of "How was your day?"
    - What did you learn
    - What was good? What was bad?
    - What was your favorite special?, etc.
  - Please help empty take-home folders
  - Math games are available as well
- Meredith Vogel and Cathy Dykes reminded teachers to spend their allocated \$100
  - A form will be shared with Dr Podraza to include in her weekly staff newsletter

# PRINCIPAL'S REPORT – Dr. Podraza

- Zoom Link availability for attending remotely due to an absence
  - If your child is sick let them be sick and recover prior to completing absent work
  - If they are recovered from being sick but still under quarantine
    - communicate with nurse, Podraza, and teacher and a Zoom link will be generated for them to attend remotely after a 24-hour notice
  - If your child is required to go home during the day due to a symptomatic family member, allow 24 hours for the link to be generated

- If you are on vacation, work/Zoom link will not be sent ahead of time
  - district policy states work will be sent upon return
- If you choose to quarantine after a vacation let the team know (nurse, Podraza, and teacher) and then the link will be generated for remote instruction
- This is due to the adjustments that will need to be made to the delivery of the instructional materials and the preparation needed to allow for materials to translate digitally.
- Planning For Next Year
  - Please fill out the <u>Thought Exchange</u>
  - ISBE partnered with IDPH and released guidelines on 3.9.21
- Staff vaccinations are progressing likely completing 2nd doses for Jefferson staff this week
- <u>2nd Trimester Jefferson Survey</u> has been released
  - $\circ~$  so far we have ~60 responses
  - We would love at least 100
  - In the fall we had ~140
  - Will be included in Dr. Podraza's email one more time
- **OJOB** has wrapped up and was wonderful
- Dr. Podraza has challenged the school to read 1 Million Pages!
  - Students become better readers through reading soi this encourages reading
  - End of every week totals will be reviewed and tracked on a thermometer in the school
  - Grade-level classes are competing against each other for the next 3 months
  - Kids are excited and convinced they will achieve
  - Students can record pages read both in and out of school
  - Each student has to read ~2000 during the remainder of the year
  - Hoping to partner with individuals or businesses to pledge \$100 to the food pantry per every 100,000 pages read
  - At 500,000 page benchmark Dr Podraza will read a book from the roof!
  - Once met will have an all-school read-out
    - Outside in groups of 50 and can sit outside and rad with blankets, etc with a lunch or a snack - possibly provided by
    - Will watch Charlotte's Web in their classroom on this day as well!
  - 3 full school Fire Drills between now and April so may see students outside
- Vacation Quarantine Recommendations
  - Get tested with a viral test 3-5 days after test quarantine for 7 days regardless of results
  - If you choose not to get tested it is a 10-day quarantine
  - If less than 3 days of missed school, no need to submit a form, however your child's teacher should be notified and reported via the attendance line
  - $\circ$   $\,$  Masked air travel is NOT considered high risk
